

A Note from the Director...

Jesus Christ Superstar was originally written as a concept album; an album whose tracks hold a larger meaning collectively than they do individually. A Broadway show soon followed the album, erupting into controversy, due to the fact that its composers did not include the Divinity of Jesus Christ, about whom it is written. Instead, the focus is on the human side of Jesus. I appreciate this focus. I question how I can personally relate to such a historical person, or how can I relate the stories about him, what he taught, how I can use what he taught in my own life in today's world... if I cannot relate to him as a human being.

Growing up, I remember listening to this concept album. I chose to direct this production of *Jesus Christ Superstar* as a concept show. This story has been produced in different time periods, but seeing as this particular story and its message has transcended time, I chose to focus on the emotions and psychology of being human; to focus on the emotions that Jesus, Judas, Pilate, Herod, Mary, the Apostles, the high priests, and society felt, and those that we still feel today: friendship, love, frustration, anger, fear, anxiety, anticipation, confusion, envy, satisfaction, admiration, mistrust, to name a few.

Color symbolism is used to focus on certain characters, and their relationship to Jesus. Blue represents Devotion. The Apostles are clothed in various shades of blue, which shows various levels of devotion to their teacher. Judas and Peter both wear yellow; the color of Denial and Betrayal. Caiaphas, Annas, and Pilate all wear black, representing Death. Caiaphas also wears red, a symbol of Power as High Priest. Simon Zealotes shows up in orange for Energy, as he is ready to fight against the system for Jesus. Mary shows Affection in pink.

Red is also used for the red carpet entrance of Jesus in the Overture (representing the power of Fame): first in Simon Zealotes (representing who gets the power), second in the table runner in the Last Supper (representing the power of relationship), and in one final scene (look for it) which represents the... Well, I will let you figure that one out... all representing various positions of Power that fight against each other.

Other things to look for, and I won't tell you why: posters in the Overture, Jesus' shirt, and green "palms" (Life) in Hosanna.

And I'll give you a hint to the last use of red, for Power... it's hanging on a cross...

I'm humbled that KVTA asked me back to the area to direct this show... Grateful for the space and freedom to create... So very proud of the cast and staff we put together to bring you this show... Grateful that you showed up... Hoping you realize that you are loved. Enjoy.


